The university was founded in 1959 as a college for black students, with the aim of training teachers and civil servants for leadership of a separate black community. In 1982 the university officially rejected apartheid, 12 years before the government would finally bring the regime to an end. The university draws on its history for inspiration. It aims to inspire a more equal society through its teaching and research. There are seven faculties at UWC: arts, community and health sciences, dentistry, economic and management sciences, education, law and natural sciences.

# Research Topic

My research focuses on the organization of urban agriculture in Mitchells Plain, Cape Town.

The study will be carried out in Mitchells Plain, a township in Cape Town. Generally, Mitchells Plain is low-income neighbourhood characterised by poverty and crime. Therefore, urban agriculture is one of the stratagems adopted by its inhabitants to argument household nutrition.

The study findings will provide policymakers and urban farmers with useful data on best practices to enhance urban agriculture activities in the area.
